


NDLEA Proposes Mandatory Drug Tests For Varsity Admission

he Commandant of the National Drug Law Enforcement Agency (NDLEA), Kwara State, Hajia Fatima Abiola-Popoola, has proposed that universities should require newly admitted students to undergo mandatory drug tests as part of their admission process.

She explained that this would "Serve as a preventive measure while offering early intervention and counselling for

those already using drugs to prevent them from becoming problematic

Hajia Abiola-Popoola disclosed this during a radio programme in Ilorin monitored by our correspondent. The NDLEA boss further expressed concern over the rising number of drug users in the country, particularly among females. She warned that this trend poses serious risks to families and

society at large.

She said "A 2018 survey shows that 14.3 million people were using drugs in Nigeria. One out of 7 persons in Nigeria is a drug user and one out of 4 drug users is a woman.
"This shows that the society is in


trouble because a woman is the administrator of the home.

NELFUND: Take Advantage Of Scheme, Use It Wisely, UI VC Counsels Students

ice Chancellor (VC) of University of Ibadan (UI), Prof. Kayode Adebowale, has hailed the Federal Government for establishing Nigerian Education Loan Fund (NELFUND). He gave the commendation while delivering opening address during an interactive session between Abuja NELFUND Office and UI students at an event held at the university's Trenchard Hall. Adebowale hailed the Federal Government's efforts to support students in furthering their education with ease. He said the interactive session was part of NELFUND's outreach sensitisation programme to encourage UI students, who might be hesitant to apply due to lack of understanding of the programme. He reiterated the ongoing challenge of funding in federal institutions and acknowledged that the scheme was a significant step toward

alleviating students' financial

burdens.

The VC also advised students to be cautious when filling out online forms to protect their data from fraudulent individuals. The Deputy Vice Chancellor (Academic), Prof. Aderonke Baiyeroju, thanked NELFUND workers for educating UI students on the scheme.

She said many students might not realise that NELFUND was a lifeline provided by the Federal Government to ease the payment of school fees.

The Director of Process and Compliance at NELFUND, Mr. Aliyu Mohammed, said the Fund was established in fulfilment of President Bola Ahmed Tinubu's electioneering promises and urged students to key into the project. NELFUND Head of ICT Mr. Olawale Ogunleye assured students that the scheme was genuine and encouraged them to explore the opportunity.

He said the portal for applications, which opened on May 24, would remain open to all Nigerian students.

He said the loan was a revolving scheme, with the repayment starting two years after the completion of NYSC scheme.

Ogunleye, guiding the students on the application process, said the loan fund was established to improve literacy levels in Nigeria. The Registrar, Mr. Ganiyu Saliu, said the university would launch a 'UI Student NELFUND' page for questions and answers, as well as create a wallet for each student to manage the loan funds wisely. The interactive session was hybrid, with NELFUND officials joining virtually. The event also afforded students of the institution the opportunity to ask questions and clear grey areas on the scheme.



33 Nigerian students bag \$2.92m scholarships from US varsities

o fewer than 33 Nigerian students have received full scholarships totaling \$2.92m to attend American universities and colleges for the 2024/2025 academic session. The scholarships were received through the Opportunity Funds Programme of the United States Consulate General in Lagos The programme is designed to increase access to US higher institutions for highly qualified international students who have limited resources to cover the upfront costs of attending a university in the United States. "The 33 departing students 10 undergraduate and 23 graduate students will be studying a variety of subjects including biomedical engineering; computer science; mechanical engineering; earth and planetary sciences; organic and medicinal chemistry; civil, construction, and environmental engineering; among others "Following a competitive selection process, the successful students received financial aid that covered expenses involved in the college application process such as standardized tests, application fees, U.S. visa and SEVIS fees as well as air travel to the United States. EducationUSA advisers worked closely with the students through regularly scheduled meetings, seminars, and bootcamps, to assist them throughout the application process," the Consulate announced in a statement on Wednesday. Speaking at a reception in Lagos

in honour of the US-bound students, Consul General Will Stevens urged them to take advantage of the opportunities American universities have to offer and become actively involved in the many organizations and clubs that will enrich their experience as international students.

"This Fall, you will join the over 17,000 Nigerian students studying in the United States. You have successfully navigated the daunting U.S. college and university admissions process and we are so excited for your future. You have excelled in Nigeria, and I have no doubt that you will continue that path of academic excellence," Stevens told the departing students.

One of the 2023 Opportunity

One of the 2023 Opportunity Fund Programme scholars, Chigozie Odo, received full funding for a Ph.D. in Chemistry at the University of South Carolina.

His doctoral research will focus on immuno-therapy to contribute to lasting solutions to the treatment of cancer.

Odo, who lost his father and sole breadwinner for his family during his second year at university, expressed appreciation to the US government for covering the upfront costs of applying to U.S. universities through the Opportunity Funds Program. "My dream of studying in the United States which seemed impossible is now a reality," he added


4. Ahmadu Bello University

142 Nigerians Get EU Postgraduate Erasmus Scholarships Programme

Nigerians have been offered postgraduate scholarships by the European Union (EU) for the 2024-25 academic session. The gesture is under the EU flagship educational programme, Erasmus+.

Nigeria retains its number one spot among beneficiaries of the EU postgraduate scholarships in Africa for the 6th year as well as a place among the top five recipient countries globally.

142 Nigerian awardees are among the initial batch of beneficiaries, announced by the organisers of the programme in Brussels.

The number is likely to increase. Most of the awardees will start their Erasmus+ journey in September 2024.

The pre-departure orientation aimed to provide the recipients with hands-on tips on how to make the best of the immense opportunities inherent in the prestigious scholarship.

The programmes will run for 12-24 months, with each beneficiary studying in at least three different

universities in as many countries within and outside the EU during the period.

According to a statement by the EU embassy in Abuja: "The Nigerian awardees have been admitted into some of the most in-demand cutting-edge programmes including Renewables-based Power Systems, Chemical Innovation and Regulation, Public Health in Disasters, Biorefinery, European MSc in Marine Environment 2030, Soils science, Systems for Sustainable Engineering, Sustainable Mineral and Metal Processing Engineering, Sustainable Ship and Shipping and several more.

"On the successful completion of the programme, an EMJMD scholar will receive a master's degree to be jointly awarded by a consortium of universities, in the framework of the EMJMD programme a key component of Erasmus+."

At a pre-departure orientation organised for the scholarship awardees in Abuja on Thursday, the EU Ambassador to Nigeria and ECOWAS, Ms Samuela Isopi,

underlined the significance of the Erasmus Mundus Joint Master Degree (EMJMD) programme, now in its 20th year, with its highly transformative impact on individuals, higher education institutions, and countries both within and outside of the EU. Over the last two decades, Erasmus Mundus has brought together top universities from all over the EU and beyond to jointly organise excellent Master's courses, merging the best parts of each national programme to form a new. integrated, and unique international study programme. The programme offers a unique

appeal to prospective students, with its high academic standards, unparalleled mobility paths, and attractive financial support.

The EU has been ramping up support to Nigeria's higher education sector through its key funding programmes Erasmus+ in the higher education sector, and Horizon Europe for research and innovation.

Erasmus+ offers many opportunities apart from its flagship

scholarship programmes: it supports mobility and short stays in Europe for researchers, students, and staff, capacity-building of universities and TVET institutions through joint projects with sister European institutions, etc. Horizon Europe offers opportunities for Nigeria-based researchers and research institutions, in particular through the "Africa Initiative II", which is addressed to African scientists.

The EU's support for education in Nigeria aligns with national objectives and focuses on equitable access to quality education and teacher training. In its education sector support, the EU works with the governments of Kano, Sokoto, Jigawa, Adamawa, Bayelsa, Oyo, Katsina, Enugu, and Plateau states The projects aim at strengthening the education system, increasing the use of digital technology for teaching, learning, and system management, and mainstreaming green skills and knowledge by investing EUR 45.4 million, in total during, 2021-2027 in the education

Overview of the Global Engineering Services Industry According to a report by Mordor Intelligence, the global engineering services industry has remained resilient over the years, with a market size worth \$1.67 trillion as of 2024. It is expected to grow its market size to \$2.04 trillion by 2029 at a compound annual growth rate (CAGR) of 4.20% between 2024 and 2029. Although the largest market for the engineering services industry is centered in the Asia Pacific region, the Middle East and Africa are showing the fastest market growth globally. One of the primary drivers of growth in the engineering services industry is the rising demand for infrastructure and the need for specialized skills across infrastructure projects. Since infrastructure projects are complicated and strenuous, the demand for innovative engineering services continues to grow. In fact, data from the US Census Bureau shows that the value of infrastructure building in the US rose from \$1.80 trillion to \$1.84 trillion between October 2022 and February 2023. The surge in the use of digital technologies such as Artificial Intelligence, cloud computing, and IoT is also a primary force driving the market.

TIWA SAVAGE

he's arguably the current biggest female artiste in Nigeria. First, she boasts a degree in professional music from the Berklee College of Music, and in 2006, she featured on the UK platform for X-Factor where she placed third in runner-up. A vocalist per excellence, Tiwa has lent her sonorous voice to international music legends Mary J Blige, Chaka Khan, George Michael, Whitney Houston and Andrea Bocelli just to mention a few.

Her powerful vocals add a whole different charm that makes her different from all the other artists. Savage sings in English and Yoruba; her music is a blend of Afrobeats, R&B, Afropop, Pop and Hiphop.

Tiwa has collaborated with many young artistes which gives her ample exposure and which is surely one of her staying powers.

Savage signed a publishing deal with Sony/ATV Music Publishing in 2009. Inspired by the growth of the Nigerian music industry, Savage moved back to Nigeria and signed with Mavin Records in 2012. She made an appearance on the label's 2012 compilation album Solar Plexus. Her debut studio album Once Upon a Time was released on 3 July 2013. Savage's second studio album, titled R.E.D, was released on 19 December 2015. In June 2016, Savage signed a management and publishing deal with Roc Nation. In September 2017, she released her debut EP Sugarcane. In May 2019, she announced her record deal with Universal Music Group and exit from Mavin Records. Savage's third studio album





emi Eberechi Alade rose from total obscurity to national prominence when she blew people's minds with her majestic poise and her sweet ringing soprano at the debut edition of Peak's Talent Hunt Show in 2009

which she eventually won and she signed to Effyzzie Music Group. Her music is a mixture of Afropop, Highlife, Dancehall, Pop and R&B, and has been of influence in several countries across Africa. She sings in English, Igbo, Pidgin, Yoruba, French, Swahili and Portuguese.

It took her five years to release her debut album, King of Queens which was a huge success. The album had the hit song, Johnny, which is still played in clubs to this day. Yemi toured several African countries including South Africa, Kenya, and Ghana, then released a deluxe version of her album with French renditions of some of the hit songs on the album.

Two years later, Yemi released her second album called Mama Africa. She featured artists from all over Africa and tackled heavy issues, especially focusing on African women.

She has released three more albums titled Black Magic, Woman of Steel, and Empress.

In 2016, she debuted on Billboard as No 4 on "Next Big Sound" Chart. She won the MTV African Music Awards for Best Female in 2015 and 2016 consecutively and was nominated for Artiste of the Year in 2015, making her the first female to win the MAMAs for Best Female consecutively twice and nominated for Artiste of the Year. In 2015, Yemi was the first African female to be nominated for the MTV Europe Music Awards (EMAs) and she was nominated for the BET Awards for

Best International Act: Africa in 2015 and 2016.

Yemi is also the second Nigerian and Afrobeats artist and the first female to hit 100 million views for a single video on YouTube after Davido. On 9 May 2017, she was announced as a coach in the second edition of The Voice Nigeria to replace 2baba who was a former coach on the live show. She coached on The Voice Nigeria (Season 2) alongside other Nigerian artists like Waje, Timi Dakolo and Patoranking.

In 2022, Yemi Alade bagged a Grammy nomination for her song Dignity with Angelique Kidjo. She alongside Kidjo were nominated for the category of Best Song for Social Change Social Merit Award. She likewise has a Grammy certificate for her collaboration with the Beninese music icon on her Mother Nature album. She is also the first Afrobeats artiste to get a Latin Grammy nomination for the song Cónexion Total with Bomba Estéreo, both the song and (Deja) the album it featured in was nominated for the awards. In 2022. The Scoove Africa ranked Yemi Alade "The Best Stage Performer in Nigeria" for the year 2022. Yemi has signed several local and international endorsement deals with notable brands such as Shell, Globacom, Maybelline, Luc Belaire, Bacardi Breezer, and an International cosmetic company, NP Gandour amongst others. Yemi Alade is one of the most influential female Nigerian artists, and an extraordinary performer. NOTABLE HITS: Johnny, Bamboo,

Temperature, Knack Am and Akwaba.

emilade Openiyi with the stage name Tems blessed us with her sonorous voice on one of the biggest Afrobeats Summer records, 2020 Wizkid's Essence which peaked at number 8 on the Billboard Hot 100 chart following the release of the remix version with Justin Bieber. The song earned her a Grammy Award nomination. That same year, she was featured on the song Fountains by Canadian rapper Drake.

Tems caught the attention of the music industry when she released her second single, Try Me, in 2019. One year later, she continued her strong start by releasing an EP titled For Broken Ears. One song, Damages, topped the Apple Music streaming charts for Nigeria.

In 2020, she released her debut extended play, For Broken Ears. Her second Extended Play, If Orange Was a Place (2021), was released after she signed a record deal with RCA

Records. In 2022, Tems' vocals from her song Higher were sampled by Future on his single, Wait for U, which led to her being credited as a featured artist alongside Drake on the song. It debuted atop the Billboard Hot 100, making her the first African artist to debut at number one and the second Nigerian artist to top the chart. The song earned her the Grammy Award for Best Melodic Rap Performance.

Tems covered Bob Marley's No Woman, No Cry for the Black Panther: Wakanda Forever soundtrack album in July 2022 and in the same month, her song Free Mind from her debut EP debuted on the Billboard Hot 100, peaking at number 46 and breaking the female record for longest charting number one song on R&B/Hip-Hop Airplay chart. She also co-wrote the song Lift Me Up by Rihanna, which earned her nominations for the Academy Award for Best Original Song, the Golden Globe Award for Best Original Song and the Grammy Award for **Best Song Written for Visual** Media.

In 2024, Tems released her debut studio album Born in the Wild and further announced a supporting tour. She has received many accolades, including a Grammy Award, a Billboard Women in Music Award, four NAACP Image Awards, four BET Awards and three Soul Train Music Awards. She attended Dowen College in Lekki and graduated in Economics from Monash University,

Johannesburg.

She's also into collaborations with the iconic fashion brand, Tommy Hilfiger and also global whiskey brand, Jameson Black.

She started her career as a gospel singer, releasing her debut studio album in 2008, titled *Ogaju*. She also played as one of the top judges in season 7 of the **Nigerian Idol TV show** in 2022. She gained public recognition in 2014 after releasing *Tiff*, a song that was nominated for **Best Alternative Song** at **The Headies 2015**. **Simi** signed a record deal with **Steve Bababeko**'s **X3M Music** in 2014, but left the label in May 2019 following the expiration of her contract.

She released her second studio album **Simisola** on September 8,

2017. Her third studio album *Omo Charlie Champagne, Vol. 1* was released to coincide with her thirty-first birthday on April 19, 2019. She launched her record label **Studio Brat** in June 2019.

In 2020, **Simi** released another EP titled *Restless II* which is part two of the initial *Restless* EP released in 2014.

Aside been a songwriter, singer and a performer, Simi is also a producer. Simi is married to another top Afrobeats artiste, Adekunle Kosoko popularly known as Adekunle Gold and they both have a beautiful daughter, Adejare. She made her acting debut in Kunle Afolayan's directorial Mokalik. She was Etisalat (now 9mobile) brand ambassador but later ported to Globacom. She also had Opera Mini endorsement in the past.

AYRA STARR

yinkansola Sarah Aderibigbe popularly known as Ayra Starr, signed to the biggest music label in Nigerian, Mavin Records is surely popping right now. Starting out as a model, Starr was signed to Quove Models, an agency in Lagos. A year later, she began posting song covers by artists like 2Baba and Andra Day, and then modeled in campaigns and music videos for other artists before becoming a musician. She uploaded a few videos of herself covering songs by other artists before deciding to pen and post her own original song Beggie Beggie in December 2019. It garnered thousands of views prior to reaching Mavin Records founder and producer Don Jazzy, who would eventually sign her to his label.

In early 2021, **Starr** achieved mainstream recognition with her eponymous debut extended play and its hit track *Away*, which spent two consecutive weeks at number four on **Nigeria's TurnTable Top 50 chart**; the song also peaked at number 17 on the **Billboard Top Triller Global chart**, paving the way for the release of her first full-length album, *19 & Dangerous* (2021).

The lead single *Bloody Samaritan* peaked atop the **Top 50 chart**, becoming the first solo song by a female artist to reach the number-one position. Starr debuted on **Pandora**

Predictions chart and on 28 August 2021, was ranked number three on **Billboard's Next Big Sound**.

Starr would later achieve mainstream international recognition in 2022, with the release of her song Rush. The song charted in several territories, including Switzerland, Ireland and the United Kingdom, where it peaked at number 24. It earned Starr her first nomination at the 66th Annual Grammy Awards for Best African Music Performance.

With the song, Starr became the voungest African female artist to surpass 100 Million views on a single video on YouTube, and also the first to do so within 5 months. On 4 March 2023, Starr took to social media to announce her music was used as soundtrack for blockbuster American action movie, Creed III. On 13 July 2023, Starr announced that she would headlining her first world tour titled 21: The World Tour. The tour included 40 stops across North America, Africa, Europe and Australia. On 27 October 2023, David Guetta featured Ayra Starr and Lil Durk on a houseinfluenced Afrobeats song titled Big

On 5 March 2024, American R&B artist **Chris Brown** announced that **Starr** would be one of the opening acts for his 2024 arena tour in North America. On 8 April 2024, Jamaican record producer **Rvssian** released the single Santa in collaboration with Starr and reggaeton artist **Rauw Alejandro**. The song helped **Starr** become the first

female Nigerian artist to reach a peak of 20 million monthly listeners on **Spotify**. During a **Fenty** event in London that month, **Starr** met with **Rihanna** to discuss the possibility of a musical collaboration. Her album *The Year I Turned 21* made her the first Nigerian female artist on the **Billboard 200 chart**; the album debuted at number 195 on June 10, 2024. Talking about brand endorsements, **Ayra Starr** used to pitch her tent with **Pepsi** but she's now a **Coke** brand ambassador. She's also **Darling Hair Extension** brand ambassador. She's also the Africa spoke person for beauty brand, **Maybelline**.

Nigeria's tech guru Linus Williams rejected \$10m from foreign investor over BillPoint app which he invented.



Bloomberg donates \$600m to historically black US medical schools

merica's four medical schools belonging to historically black colleges and universities (HBCUs) have been gifted \$600m (£473m; €550m) by Michael Bloomberg, the former New York mayor and billionaire founder of the financial technology and media company Bloomberg LP. Bloomberg's donation follows his \$1bn gift last month to his alma mater, Johns Hopkins University in Baltimore, which allowed its medical school to offer free tuition to most of its students.1

In 2020 he gave \$100m to pay off the student debt of enrolled students at the HBCU medical schools. Last week their presidents were invited to a meeting with Bloomberg Philanthropies in New York, which they thought was an event to commemorate that gift. Instead, they were presented with \$600m more

Howard University College of Medicine in Washington, DC; Morehouse School of Medicine in Atlanta, Georgia; and Meharry Medical College, in Nashville, Tennessee, will each receive \$175m. These are the largest three donations ever made to HBCUs and will roughly double the existing endowments of all three of those colleges. Charles R Drew University of Medicine and Science, Los Angeles, will receive \$75m.



Sharp fall in international applicants wanting to study at UK universities

he financial pressures facing universities continue to mount after the latest immigration figures showed a sharp fall in the number of international applicants wanting to study in the UK.

The Home Office's initial figures for July found that about 15% fewer sponsored student visa applications were received last month, continuing the downward trend seen since the start of the year and following the previous government's efforts to restrict the number of visas issued. Between January and the end of July, the Home Office said that overall student applications were down by 16% compared with the same period in 2023. After universities received bumper enrolments from international students in 2022 and 2023. admissions are likely to remain



the sector's revenue from UK students, making it more reliant on the higher tuition fees received from overseas students and more vulnerable to fluctuations.

Some institutions say they are braced for a 50% fall in new international enrolments this year, especially in one-year postgraduate courses.

Since January, new regulations have barred most undergraduate and taught postgraduate students from bringing dependent family members to the UK with them. The latest Home Office figures confirm a steep drop, with 13,100 applications from dependents of students between January and July 2024 81% fewer than in January to July 2023. August is the highest month for visa applications, and the

applications, and the Home Office has cautioned that it "will be necessary to see this peak in student applications in the autumn before we can assess the full extent of any changes this year". But an earlier poll of 75 institutions by the British Universities'. International Liaison Association found that nine out of 10 had received fewer international applications for this autumn compared with 2023. New data published by the Higher

Education Statistics Agency revealed that the proportion of first-class degrees awarded to undergraduates continued to fall last year, as universities in England responded to ministerial allegations of grade inflation.

The 2022-23 figures showed that 29% of undergraduate degrees were graded as first-class honours, down from 32% in 2021-22 and 36% in 2020-21, and only slightly higher than the 28% awarded in 2018-19 before the Covid pandemic brought more generous marking for affected students.

Nick Hillman, director of the Higher Education Policy Institute, said: "The change makes the top grade a little more meaningful for employers once again, even though close to one-third still get a first. "But we'll have to wait to see if this is a long-term trend or a shorterterm blip. It may be that the new government is less concerned by university grades and more concerned by other things, which could encourage people to take their eye off the ball. Meanwhile, the proportion of lower second-class degrees, or 2:2s, rose

from the tropical agar tree, which is thought to originate in Assam in India. When the tree is infected by a mould known as Phialophora parasitica it reacts by producing a dense, dark and fragrant resin to protect itself. It is the resin-embedded heartwood of the tree that is the source of oud.

The trees are grown throughout South-East Asia, India and Bangladesh and agarwood is said to be the most expensive timber in the world – indeed, one of the most expensive of all natural raw ingredients. 



I think it's amazing to see how far Afrobeats has come and wish the genre continued success. I remember my father introducing me to Fela Kuti's music as a kid and then when I started producing at 15 he was one of the first people I sampled.

What stands DJ power out from every other DJ putting out records? I think the main difference is that I

I think the main difference is that I produce my own music and have my own sound and it's original. A lot of DJs have producers make the music for them so the song sounds like whatever producer they use. I've always experimented with fusing different sounds and trying to create new genres like Afro-Trap, Drill-Dancehall, Soca-House etc. "Choose To Lie" is also a fusion between Afrobeats and R&B.

You've worked with a diverse range of artists in your career. What draws you to collaborate with such a variety of musicians, and what do you enjoy most about these partnerships?

What I enjoy most is first creating the music and getting it to perfection. Then I know when the artist adds their magic to it, it's golden. The best feeling is being in the studio with the artist and hearing what they create on the track. That's where you get the best vibe and I love producing vocals.

Your recent collaboration, "Choose To Lie," with Alex Mali, Reekado Banks, and Ajura has garnered a lot of attention. Can you share the inspiration behind this track and how the collaboration came to life?

The inspiration started with a melody my brother Mac-Steph sent me and then I worked on the track for months till I was happy with it. Sometimes it's like that I never rush till I get it right. Then I had a session with my friend Alex Mali and she heard it, loved it and recorded. She killed it! Since the track had an Afro Vibe and she had soulful vocals on it, I wanted to add an African artist to compliment the sound. A few artists sent some references but when l heard Ajura's vocals I loved what he added to it. Then when Reekado Banks did his verse I was like wow! We got one! He killed it.

What was the most exciting or memorable moment during the creation of "Choose To Lie"?

When Alex Mali recorded her vocals I knew it was magic, the vibe in the studio was crazy. She's one of the most talented artists I've ever worked with and we have amazing chemistry in the lab. Then when Reekado and Ajura added their vocals, I knew this was going up as they killed it and brought the amazing energy the track needed.

The song's narrative revolves around themes of love, selfdiscovery, and transformation. How did these themes resonate with you personally during the creative process?

I think a lot of people can relate to the theme, we've all been in relationships and been lied to. Me personally, I know sometimes you like someone and they don't like you the same way or vice versa. Everyone's been in that situation before.


What unique contributions did each artist bring to "Choose To Lie," and how did their individual styles complement the overall sound of the song?

I think everyone brought amazing vibes to the track and complement each other. It started with the music and then Alex brought her concept and soulful sound to it. Reekado brings the smooth African element and really brings a big hype to the song. Adding Ajura brings everything together because his vocals are the bridge and his verse is crazy too. The final stage was editing the vocals and arrangement and adding sounds to complement everything like horns etc.


How do you see "Choose To Lie" fitting into the current music landscape, and what do you hope it will bring to your fans and new listeners?
